2. PUBLIC HEALTH BYLAWS

2.1 Removal of refuse and carcasses

- (1) Domestic and business refuse other than that referred to in paragraph (2) hereof.
- (a) Per weekly removal R28.62
- Per receptacle of 85 ℓ or part thereof, subject to the following minima –
- (i) Private dwellings and flats that are being used exclusively for domestic purposes and non-profit making offices and clubs, per month R28.62
- (ii) Business and other premises not included in (i), per month R84.24
- (b) Per five times weekly removal per receptacle or part thereof R84.24 with a minimum charge of R168.16
- (2) Removal of bulky refuse, per cubic metre or part thereof (minimum 3 m³) R46.33
- (3) Removal of carcasses
- (a) Cattle, donkeys, horses and other similar size animals, per carcass R173.77
- (b) Sheep, pigs, goats, per carcass R65.45
- (c) Dogs and cats, per removal R80.68
- (d) Any removal after hours, per carcass, double the tariffs for (a), (b) and (c)
- (4) Removal of refuse from bulk containers (1.75 m³)
- (a) Daily removal (excluding Saturdays and Sundays) per container per month R1040.15

1x 210 ℓ container = 3 x 85 ℓ containers : with the understanding that when 8 x 210 ℓ containers are being utilized, the tariff of charges for a bulk container of 1,75 m³ shall be applicable.

- (6) Removal of refuse from 30 m³ containers R708.59
- per removal with a minimum of four removals per month, provided that the minimum number of removals shall not apply if the container is temporarily hired for a period of less than one month.
- (7) Refuse removal charges in respect of vendors R40.50 p.a

2.2 Temporary service

Provided that the Council shall be entitled to deduct from such deposit the cost of repairing, replacing or making good any damage, breakage, loss or disfigurement to the toilet sustained during the period of hire and any balance shall thereafter be re-

funded to the hirer. Provided further that should the amount of the said deposit be insufficient to cover such cost, the hirer shall be liable for the payment of any additional amount involved. In the event of no damage, breakage, loss or disfigurement to the toilet being sustained as aforesaid the deposit shall be refunded to the hirer.

3. DRAINAGE BYLAWS

3.1 Service Connection Fees

3.2 Sewerage charges

The tariff for sewer charges is coupled to the monthly water consumption of every lot as set out hereunder:

 - (i) A minimum charge is levied on all vacant or unmetered properties as well as properties where water consumption is less than 10kl R12.80 p.m.
 - (ii) Where water consumption is between 11kl and 15kl R16.20 p.m.
 - (iii) Where the consumption is between 16kl and 20kl R33.70 p.m.
 - (iv) Where the consumption is between 21kl and 30kl R43.10 p.m.
 - (v) Where the consumption is between 31kl and 50kl R47.15 p.m.
 - (vi) Where the water consumption exceeds 51kl R67.35 p.m.
- (b) Commercial and industrial properties:
 - (i) Where water up to 15kl is consumed R67.35 p.m.
 - (ii) Where the water consumption is between 16kl and 20kl R94.25 p.m.
 - (iii) Where the water consumption is between 21kl and 30kl R107.75 p.m.

(iv) Where the water consumption is between 31kl and 50kl R121.20 p.m.

(v) Where the water consumption is between 51kl and 100kl R134.65 p.m.

(vi) Where the water consumption is between 101kl and 250kl R201.95 p.m.

(vii) Where the water consumption is between 251kl and 500kl R403.90 p.m.

(viii) Where the water consumption exceeds 500kl per month R1009.75.

C. INDUSTRIAL AND TRADE EFFLUENT CHARGES

(1) The owner or occupier of trade premises from which as a result of such trade or of any process incidental thereto, any effluent is discharged into the Council's sewer shall, in addition to any other charges for which he may be liable in terms of this schedule pay to the Council an Industrial Effluent charge which shall be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

Charge in c/kl = $X_1 + (S \times X_2) + A \times X_3$ where X_1 represents the cost per kl for conveyance to the purification works, $(S \times X_2)$ represents the cost per kl of primary and anaerobic treatment of the settleable solids and $(A \times X_3)$ represents the cost of aerobic treatment of the settled sewage.

In the above formula –

$X_1 = '31c'$

$X_2 = '0,286c'$

$X_3 = '0,068c'$

S = volume fraction of settleable solids (ml/l)

A = oxygen absorption in a period of 4h (mg/l)

(2) A monthly charge payable by the owner or occupier of any trade premises in respect of any trade effluent discharged into the Council's sewers, shall be assessed by the Engineer at half-yearly intervals and be notified to such owner or occupier not later than the 31st day of January or the 31st day of July, in each year, as the case may be, in accordance with the formula prescribed in paragraph (1) hereof on the basis of the average result of not less than four analyses of the strength and quality of such effluent carried out at any time by the Engineer during the preceding six months, which analyses may, in the discretion of the Engineer, be based on the individual snap samples or on composite samples collected in a manner approved by him from time to time. The charge thus assessed shall be payable in respect of the volume of trade effluent recorded or determined as having been discharged each month during the ensuing six months with effect from the first reading of the trade effluent, or water meter as the case may be, for the month of February or August in each year.

(3) In the case of trade premises from which trade effluent is discharged into the Council's sewers for the first time a charge will be payable in respect of the interim period between the date of first discharge and the 31st January or 31st July, as the case may be. Such charge shall be assessed in accordance with the formula prescribed in paragraph (1) on the basis of the average result of not less than four analyses carried out by the Engineer from the date of first discharge and shall be paid in respect of the volume of trade effluent

discharge each month during the said interim period.

(4) A minimum monthly charge of R15.50 per kilolitre shall be payable by the owner or occupier of any trade premises in respect of any trade effluent discharging into the Council's sewers, provided that the said minimum charge shall not be applicable where the volume of trade effluent exceeds 50 kilolitres per month.

3.3 Clearing of sewer blockages

Where sewer blockages are cleared within private properties without the need for excavation, the following tariffs apply:

Where it is necessary to excavate in order to clear a blockage, it will be done at cost plus 10%.

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5. ELECTRICITY TARIFF OF CHARGES

1. Definitions:

Active Energy Charge: A charge for each kilowatt hour (kWh) of energy active consumed.

Basic Charge: A monthly basic charge is payable for all metered connections whether electricity is consumed or not and all vacant erven where a building can be erected for any purpose and which can be connected to the electricity reticulation network.

Estimated Load: The total connected load of an installation reduced by the diversity factors according to SANS : 0142 : 1993.

High Voltage: A nominal voltage of 132 000 Volt ($\pm 5\%$) between any of the three phase conductors (SANS 1019).

Low Voltage: A nominal voltage of 400 Volt ($\pm 10\%$) between any of the three phase and the neutral conductor (SANS 1019).

Maximum Demand Charge: Payable for each kilovolt-ampere (kVA) supplied by the Council to a consumer during a demand integrating period of 30 (thirty) consecutive minutes in the month or such time periods in the month as may be applicable.

Medium Voltage: A nominal voltage of 11 000 Volt ($\pm 5\%$) between any of the three phase conductors (SANS 1019).

Notified Maximum Demand: The consumer shall notify the Council in writing of the maximum demand in kilovolt-ampere (hereinafter referred to as "the notified maximum demand") which the consumer requires the Council to provide.

One calendar-month's notice must be given in writing by the consumer to the Council of any increase or decrease in the notified maximum demand and of the date upon which the revised supply is required. From the date on which the revised supply is made available, the notified maximum demand shall be increased or decreased accordingly.

Time-off-use tariff: The time-off-use tariff is appropriate for a consumer who is able to manage the energy consumption and maximum demand by shifting load to the defined ESKOM's specified time schedule as amended from time to time.

2. Conditions applicable to all tariff scales:

1. A consumer may apply to the Council to be billed on either the standard or the time-off-use tariff. A consumer may not apply to change over from the standard

to the time-of-use tariff or from the time-of-use to the standard tariff more than once in a period of 12 months.

2. A consumer may apply to the Council to reduce or to increase the size of a circuit breaker (MCB) or the notified maximum demand. A consumer may not apply to reduce the circuit breaker or to reduce the notified maximum demand more than once in a period of 12 months.

3. Scale 1 : 20A Domestic Life Line Supply:

1. This scale shall also apply to churches, charitable organizations and sporting bodies with a maximum estimated load of 20A single phase.

 - (iv) For any male dog of any other strain not defined in paragraph (a) (i) R4.24
- (b) For any dog in any household in excess of two dogs R42.40

In the event of there being dogs of both sexes in any one household, and unspayed bitch shall be regarded as the first dog (and where applicable the second dog) for purposes of assessing the licence fees payable.
